Firefighter Level 1B Transitions (84-Hour)

This is the Firefighter Level 1, 84-hour transition course. This course provides the training, knowledge, and skills required to become a state certified firefighter trained to the Firefighter I level. Upon completion you must pass a State of Ohio test to become certified. This course can be used as the second step in a three step process in becoming a full-time professional firefighter trained to the Firefighter I and II level. Prerequisites: High School Diploma or GED and assessment testing.

Firefighter Level 1C-1 (120-Hour)

This course provides the training, knowledge, and skills required to become a state certified firefighter trained to the Firefighter I level. Upon completion, you must pass a State of Ohio test to become certified. This course can be used as the first step in a two step process in becoming a full-time professional firefighter trained to the Firefighter I and II level. Prerequisites: High School Diploma or GED and assessment testing.

Firefighter Level II (120-Hour)

This course provides the training, knowledge, and skills required to become a state certified firefighter trained to the Firefighter II level. Upon completion, you must pass a State of Ohio test to become certified. This course can be used as the first step in a two step process in becoming a full-time professional firefighter trained to the Firefighter I and II level. Prerequisites: High School Diploma or GED and assessment testing.

EMT-Basic

At the EMT-Basic level, coursework emphasizes emergency skills, such as managing respiratory, trauma, and cardiac emergencies, and patient assessment. Formal courses are often combined with time in an emergency room or ambulance. The program provides instruction and practice in dealing with bleeding, fractures, airway obstruction, cardiac arrest, and emergency childbirth. You will learn how to use and maintain common emergency equipment, such as backboards, suction devices, splints, oxygen delivery systems and stretchers. Graduates of approved EMT-Basic training programs must pass a written and practical examination. Prerequisites: High School Diploma or GED and assessment testing.



TRADE AND INDUSTRIAL

Certified Industrial Maintenance

The Certified Industrial Maintenance course is one-year, 606-hour program designed for an entry level maintenance technician. This can be taken as a whole program or the modules can be taken individually. Prerequisites: High School Diploma or GED and assessment testing.

Modern Machining Applications

The Modern Machining Applications course is 406-hour program consisting of coursework in Shop Math, Trigonometry, Basic Blueprint Reading, Manual Machine Shop Basics I and II, CNC, and MasterCAM. Prerequisites: High School Diploma or GED and assessment testing.

Certified Welding Program

This is a 330-hour class certifying students in STICK and MIG welding. You can qualify with one inch plate for STICK welding and 3/8 inch plate for MIG welding. We will follow the D1.1 structural guidelines as per the American Welding Society. Prerequisites: High School Diploma or GED and assessment testing.

HEALTH OCCUPATIONS



1500 Hour Cosmetology Program

Our Cosmetology Program is designed to prepare you to successfully pass the Ohio State Board of Cosmetology examination and enter into employment as a licensed cosmetologist. Instructors are hairdressers and salon owners with hands-on, current knowledge of the industry. Prerequisites: High School Diploma or GED and assessment testing.



Nail Tech Program

The Nail Tech Program is designed to prepare you to successfully pass the Ohio State Board of Cosmetology examination and enter into employment as a licensed Nail Technician. A recognized, professional product line is used in our salon and creative learning practices help inspire student creativity. Instructors are licensed nail technicians/cosmetologists with hands-on, current knowledge of the industry. You will complete this 300-hour class in about six (6) months.



Administrative Medical Assistant

This 414-hour program is designed for those interested in learning comprehensive skills needed to work in the front office of a medical facility. Students will take the Certified Medical Office Assistant Certification exam through NCCT. Prerequisites: High School Diploma or GED, and assessment testing.

Clinical Medical Assistant

This 434-hour program will prepare you to work in a variety of medical offices where the ability to perform in-office diagnostic procedures is necessary. Instruction includes phlebotomy, EKG, medication administration and much more. Prerequisites: High School Diploma or GED, assessment testing, and the first injection of the Hepatitis B series of inoculations and the TB test.

Medical Coding/Billing Specialist

This 398-hour course will combine medical terminology, anatomy and physiology, physician-based coding and medical billing. The coding will include CPT, ICD-9, and HCPCS coding. Students will take the AAPC Certification testing. The billing cluster will use a computerized billing system to log patient information, and follow-up of claims to major insurance companies. Students will sit for the CMBS certification. Prerequisites: High School Diploma or GED, and assessment testing

Medical Assistant Accredited—Allied Health Education

This 1045-hour program combines clinical, laboratory, and administrative skills to prepare graduates for a variety of allied health jobs. Learn medical terminology, anatomy and physiology, a variety of laboratory procedures, EKG, phlebotomy, medication administration, CPR/First Aid, and more. Students will sit for the National CMA Certification. Prerequisites: High School Diploma or GED, assessment testing and the first injection of the Hepatitis B Series.

Pharmacy Technician

The function of the pharmacy technician is to assist the pharmacist with the day-to-day activities in the pharmacy. A Pharmacy Technician assists the pharmacist in packaging or mixing a prescription, maintaining client records, referring clients to the pharmacist for counseling, assisting with inventory and purchasing, as well as collecting payments and coordinating billing. Eligible students completing this 334-hour program will sit for the National Certification exam. Prerequisites: High School Diploma or GED, and assessment testing.

Phlebotomy

This 257-hour course provides students with the skill and knowledge to collect blood samples by venipuncture and fingerstick. The course covers all academic classes regarding phlebotomy and 100+ hours of clinical practicum. You will sit for phlebotomy certification through NCCT upon completion of this course. Prerequisites: High School Diploma or GED, and assessment testing and the first injection of the Hepatitis B series of inoculations.
